## Whitehills School Association Meeting Minutes

1. Call to order with welcome and introductions
2. Approval of agenda

a. Moved to approve, seconded, and approved.
3. Principal's report
a. Thanked WSA for support for preparing for the school year and the first day of school.
b. Thanks for renovations to the teacher's lounge.
c. Met with school improvement team this summer and it was decided that we need to convey to our students that we need to narrow down our focus on the three main goals we want to share with our students and our community. Kids know now that these are the expectations that we have on them this school year.

d. Staff meeting today included positive postcards - teachers can share notes with students to recognize them for demonstrating positive behavior. We talked about the Fun Run Assembly that is to happen. We discussed Halloween and the parade that will take place the Friday before Halloween; some younger grades will do projects.
e. We have a new positive behavior curriculum called Second Step which has 22 lessons. Teachers will be presenting these age/grade appropriate lessons throughout the year.
f. Curriculum Night
i. Teacher Session will start right at 6:00pm; first session will be from 6:006:25pm and then the second from 6:30-6:55. Ribbon Cutting will be at 7:00pm.
g. Indoor Recess will be the same as it has been in the past with assistance
h. We also talked about WSA meetings - we cannot make teachers attend but have a good response tonight (3 teachers present).
i. Teacher evaluations are new this year and there will be 15 minutes observations with immediate follow up.
j. During negotiations, specials were cut by a few minutes; if special teachers have leftover FTE minutes then they can be assigned to help support in a classroom or
do a check-in/check-out system. This depends on how many sections are in each building. This year we have a Math Coach in this building but we do not have a Math Interventionist. Data analysis is held to determine what children will attend this coach based on where they land on the scale.
k. If there are issues related to teachers or instruction that you may have concerns about, I would prefer that you bring those concerns to the teacher, then come to the Principal; this forum (WSA) is not where these issues should be brought up.
I. Homeless person near the park
i. Concerns were brought up, and Principal Wells will talk to Officer Whelan again and continue to convey to the children where the school boundaries are.
ii. Maybe if people write in to the City Council it may yield some better responses.
13. Teachers' report(s) and activities
a. Ms. Katie Pike
i. So excited to come Whitehills; has been teaching for ten years and lives in East Lansing.

14. Would love to run this here at Whitehills and is so excited to get the ball rolling. WSA expressed interest and support for this. She will need some volunteers and is hoping for some support.

15. In class programs are important right now because the foundation is being laid right now for when they are older and have a more directed focus on the arts. Parents will be invited to join the classroom at this age to see their kids perform ("in-formances").

i. Thank you so much for the signs and banners from the first day of school and also for the teacher's lounge.
c. Ms. Danielle Desilets
i. So excited to be here; I student taught last year at Marble and coached JV basketball. I'm excited to bring things that I have taught to my new classroom.
17. Kath Edsall - East Lansing Board Member
a. I have five kids, from ages 5 to 24 . School Board members took a hiatus on attending parent council meetings last year; I am not sure why but am happy to attend again this year. We will rotate what school we attend so that we can all meet and see the different schools and parents.
