- 5. Teachers' report(s) and activities
 - a. Mrs. Pike
 - Upper and Lower grades will be divided for performances this year. Grades 3-5 will be in the spring to help them gain some more skills prior to the showcase. Kindergarten through second grade "Winter Musical" will be Wednesday, December 6 at 6:30pm. This is the same week as the Book Fair.  - a. WSA will work with Ms. Wagner and Mrs. Volovsek on this.
 - vi. Sign Up Genius is posted on website for adult leaders at each gathering point.
 - vii. Safe Routes to School update from Ms. Wagner (SRTS district coordinator):
 - a. SRTS held a big meeting over the summer and brought together the school principals, district administration, representatives from the city's Department of Public Works, and representatives from the ELPD. This was the first time all these constituents has met together on the topic of SRTS.
 - b. SRTS is in the process of hiring a community coordinator who has the flexibility to travel to the various schools at different points during the day.
 - c. Walking School Bus begins on September 20. Each Wednesday, Ms. Wagner will lead WSB beginning from Foxcroft and Applegate. They hope to add the WSB from other points in the neighborhood and/or on other days as well. May try to encourage participation by getting ELPD K9 unit or bike officer to accompany group sometime.

d. Long term goal for SRTS is to obtain a large infrastructure grant in partnership with the City of East Lansing to be used for major projects such as sidewalks in the Whitehills neighborhood.
