- 1. Call to order
 - a. Introductions around the virtual room

- 2. Approval of October 2021 WSA meeting minutes
 - a. After a motion to approve and a second, the meeting minutes were unanimously approved.
- 3. Principal and staff reports, news, questions
 - a. Shane Johnson Principal
 - i. Sarah Moreno has been hired a new social worker, working Monday through Friday. She has over 10 years of experience. Previously sharing social workers among buildings.
 - ii. Brenda McKenzie lunchroom and crossing guard has transitioned to a new role in charge of the kitchen. Looking for lunch and recess monitors.
 - iii. Cultural Awareness and Spirit Week
 - iv. Amy Sayers: Piloting project with 1st graders focused on outdoor learning and planted a tree recently and other projects focused on learning from nature.
 - v. Fourth grade classes finished last week "Because of Wynn Dixie." Superintendent Leyko was invited to class with her therapy dog.
 - vi. First COVID Vaccination Clinic. Great turn out and interest that another clinic is scheduled on Saturday. Principal Johnson will look into whether schools will be tracking vaccination percentages.
 - vii. Weekly COVID testing.
 - viii. Current DEI social justice team is made up of staff members. May be future opportunity for parents to participate in something similar.
 - ix. Open to looking into a community garden; there looks at though there is a spot for the garden.

- b. Social / Emotional / Learning check-in
 - i. Concern noted that there are many kids with emotional issues at least in part due to students being stuck at home for a year with COVID. Is this a concern at Whitehills?
 - 1. Issue was raised at the Parent Council in the context of middle school and high school; however, Marble rep indicated that it was trickling down to elementary school.
 - 2. Certainly certain kids are struggling and the school is thankful for Ms Moreno starting as a social worker. She has been busy in her first two weeks. Principal Johnson will think about what, if any, role WSA should have in supporting these efforts beyond continuing to support their own kids.

- 6. Safe Routes to School (SRTS) Update Trisha Donahue
 - a. SRTS Grant Update Ginger Ogilvie
 - i. Update on Safe Routes Major Grant
 - ii. Purpose: Help city in partnership with school district to apply for funding for infrastructure improvement.
 - 1. Federal effort that uses federal transportation dollars to improve infrastructure

- 2. MDOT and Michigan Fitness Foundation \rightarrow channels money to Michigan communities.

- iii. Major Grant focused on Engineering to help ensure that children and families have a safe way to get to school, focused on making it possible for students to walk, bike, and roll safely to schools. (100k-200k).
 - Look at walkable neighborhood around school and where sidewalks were missing in the Whitehills neighborhood. Neighborhood north of lake lansing is Meridian Township, so did not focus on this neighborhood (plus busing may be available to those families).
 - 2. Grant is meant to address the sidewalk gaps. Present this as an opportunity.
 - 3. Limitations with grant if you put sidewalk on one side of street, then you have to put it on the other side of the street.
 - 4. The various areas in which the group is looking at installing projects and put in remote parking on the North side of the school.
