## Teacher's Report:

o Awesome book fair-very appreciative of the help from parents to make it a success!
o Discussion on room parents-teachers want a room parent for each classroom. Kim SteedPage will send document to Ms. Clyma for teachers to distribute
o Book Fair: Very Successful! Total sales-\$7,300; Scholastic Dollars-\$3,400; cash values of $\$ 1,700$; Angie presented a motion to take Scholastic Dollars and allow Mr. Wells to work with staff to distribute funds for books and book supplies. Motion passed.

## School Board Rep Report: (Hillary Henderson)

o Board approved furthering honors classes at middle and high school
o Approved common assessments for $\mathrm{k}-12$; teachers will assess the same district wide/grade wide; important for equity and to make sure all kids are on the path to learning
o Still in the middle of contract negotiations; board cannot comment during negotiations; both sides have negotiating team and working with a state mediator
o MSA conference-Mr. Wells brought high school students to report on the conference in Ann Arbor: allows students to have dialogue related to achievement gap, social justice issues-about 32 school districts represented; student voice was front and centerdiscussion engaging staff members in dialogue in teaching students of color and lowincome students
*Parent concerns raised about diversity instruction for teachers and students. School social worker is working with teachers along with Mr. Wells; additional discussion and ideas
