March Reading Month

Principal's Report

- Mr. Wells plans to bring the Zoo-Zoo acrobatic group to perform for the school on March 24, 2015. The group will be touring all of the elementary schools and the 45 minute assembly fee is \$175 per school. Financial support is requested from the WSA. President Smith moved that the WSA pay the \$175 fee; the motion was seconded and affirmed by the members to pay the Zoo-Zoo acrobatic group \$175 fee.
- The new statewide testing program is the Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress (MSTEP)-it replaces MEAP permanently; testing will begin in April; paper and pencil version will be given for Whitehills: 3rd & 6th grade English Language Arts on April 19 & Math on April 27; 4th grade April 28 & April 29; 5th grade-English Language Arts on April 14 & Math on April 21; make-ups will take place through end of the school year; Principal Wells will attend training on 3/18 on the new assessment process.
- Field Trips-Mission to Mars (Kalamazoo) on May 7 for 5th grade; 2nd & 3rd going to MSU Planetarium on 4/15; 4th grade going to Meijer Gardens and Sand Dunes on 5/22;

- Lock-down discussion on types of lock-downs that could occur in the school; soft (teacher keep teaching and close blinds); hard lock down police are called; doors locked by teachers and police check perimeter for drill practice, ensure blinds are closed; other types of lock downs exist to keep kids safe; the district, school, and police are all in communication and have procedures in place to keep kids and staff safe

 Reported on discussion at 3/9 school board meeting regarding the future of Red Cedar Elementary School and the entire district-essentially much further discussion is needed regarding reconfiguration and planning for the district—the district strategic plan is through the end of 2017; needs to be expanded through 2020 to be thoughtful in the planning.
