## March Reading Month

- Thank you to Mrs. Wever and Ms. Talaski for organizing reading month. The teachers are requesting financial support to provide lunch for reading month guest author (Mr. VanDyke); President Smith moved that the WSA provide up to $\$ 50$ for lunch; the motion was seconded and affirmed by the members to spend up to $\$ 50$ on lunch for the guest author and hosting teachers.


## Principal's Report

- Mr. Wells plans to bring the Zoo-Zoo acrobatic group to perform for the school on March 24, 2015. The group will be touring all of the elementary schools and the 45 minute assembly fee is \$175 per school. Financial support is requested from the WSA. President Smith moved that the WSA pay the $\$ 175$ fee; the motion was seconded and affirmed by the members to pay the Zoo-Zoo acrobatic group \$175 fee.
- The new statewide testing program is the Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress (MSTEP)-it replaces MEAP permanently; testing will begin in April; paper and pencil version will be given for Whitehills: 3 rd $\& 6^{\text {th }}$ grade English Language Arts on April 19 \& Math on April 27; $4^{\text {th }}$ grade April 28 \& April 29; $5^{\text {th }}$ grade-English Language Arts on April 14 \& Math on April 21; makeups will take place through end of the school year; Principal Wells will attend training on $3 / 18$ on the new assessment process.
- Field Trips-Mission to Mars (Kalamazoo) on May 7 for $5^{\text {th }}$ grade; $2^{\text {nd }} \& 3^{\text {rd }}$ going to MSU Planetarium on $4 / 15 ; 4^{\text {th }}$ grade going to Meijer Gardens and Sand Dunes on 5/22;
- Mileage club: Begins on April 13 at lunch recess through end of school year; Mrs. Volovsek \& Debbie Walton (Whitehills parent) to organize. Volunteers will be requested through WSA Signup Genius system.
- Rep. Sam Singh read to $2^{\text {nd }}$ graders on March 16 for reading month.
- Vision screening for all kids on $3 / 23$
- Lock-down discussion on types of lock-downs that could occur in the school; soft (teacher keep teaching and close blinds); hard lock down police are called; doors locked by teachers and police check perimeter for drill practice, ensure blinds are closed; other types of lock downs exist to keep kids safe; the district, school, and police are all in communication and have procedures in place to keep kids and staff safe


## School Board Representative Report-Nathaniel Lake, Vice-President of School Board

- Reported on discussion at $3 / 9$ school board meeting regarding the future of Red Cedar Elementary School and the entire district-essentially much further discussion is needed regarding reconfiguration and planning for the district-the district strategic plan is through the end of 2017; needs to be expanded through 2020 to be thoughtful in the planning.
- New board members and new leadership adds to challenges to ongoing discussion/implementation/reconfiguration of Red Cedar.
- Board is committed to considering various options and working in the best interest of all children in the district.
