## Whitehills School Association April 14, 2015 Meeting Minutes

- 1. 7:05-Meeting called to order by Pres. Smith
- 2. March minutes approval: motion to approve by Pres. Smith; seconded and passed
- 3. Brief WSA Introductions for new attendees
- 4. <u>Teacher Report:</u> Ms. Kemsley (2<sup>nd</sup> grade): Teachers appreciative of WSA help; general question about field trips and buses-thoughts of tweaking the process/information for teachers along with discussion on best way to get WSA information on field trips
  - Amy Z. made motion to for Board to make financial decisions on field trips as needed in between meetings. **Motion was seconded and passed.**
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> grade to MSU Gardens; 5<sup>th</sup> grade to Science Festival @ MSU and other grades on field trips as well.

## 5. Principal's Report:

- School Improvement Team met areas to address:
  - Positive behavior support to emphasize expectations for kids; reviewing expectations building wide, especially recess and recess line-up
  - o Teachers need to greet students to be visible and meet them after recess
  - Lunchroom issues: lunch staff should be included in discussions on positive behavior; recommendation that all lunch monitors be trained on student-centered/positive approach to working with kids. Lunch has to be a balance of kids socializing and structure
  - Free play options for students: research shows some non-structured time for kids (especially lower grades) is important
  - Day of play was very successful and teachers feel it is important for kids to play and socialize with each other
- MSTEP began on 4/14 with 5<sup>th</sup> grade reading test is proving longer and more challenging than other tests
- Birthday treats: beginning of the year staff agreed to not engage in food birthday treats; instead
  offer activities; some parents have raised concerns and process will be reviewed for next year.
  Many parents are in agreement that non-food treats are best (i.e. extended recess, free time in
  class)
- Dean transportation donated busses for MSU Science Festival on Friday
- 5<sup>th</sup> grade transition meeting (MacDonald principal) to visit Whitehills on April 23
- Other activities under discussion (Aquatic center and end of year activities for kids)
- 6. <u>School Board Report:</u> Board Representative, Hillary Henderson
  - MSTEP concerns new test and new way of learning; kids are in transition; District is working on keeping up with changes; MSTEP important for baseline measurement of where students are academically; this is the state test-no opt-out option for MSTEP; Whitehills is currently a FOCUS school based on last year assessment; some concern that because test is new scores may be lower,

potentially pushing Whitehills down to a "Priority" School which has implications for funding and state involvement.

- Meeting with City of East Lansing-strong partnership with EL Public Library Library owns several 3D printers and they are available for teachers to use in their classrooms.
- April 27<sup>th</sup>: Listen and Learn tour results and school of choice numbers to be discussed at next Board meeting; responses from board members on previous issues available on board website
- Some research happening on Pre-K programming in the district

- Spring book fair: May 4-May 8; volunteers needed and hours will be based on volunteer availability

   volunteers for set-up needed (3 pm-6pm); 6 teachers so far have offered raffle services for kids to bid on
