



## New Science Club Sign-Up Procedure



Based on parent feedback to improve access to Science Club, the sign-up process has been updated. Each month, families who want to participate will need to register their student(s) in advance by using Sign Up Genius. This student sign-up will open the week prior to Science Club every month. This means families can commit to just one session at a time, spreading access more equitably and not holding spots for students who can't make it in a given month. There is a limit of 22 students for each K-1 session, and 30 students for each 2<sup>nd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grade session.

All students with Science Club permission slips on file for this academic year have been added to a sign-up group using the email(s) given on the existing permission slip; others can be added at any time by emailing a completed permission slip to Kyle Enger or turning it in at the front office. Members of this sign-up group will be emailed when the student sign-up opens each month; Sign Up Genius will also send an automated reminder before each Science Club session for which your student is registered.
